On-Line Resources

Four New Databases Now Available

These databases may be used by all within the library, or log-in with your library barcode number for 24/7 access from anywhere.

<u>A to Z World Travel</u> features 202 cities from around the world. It provides maps and practical information for travelers about the climate, excursions, food, language, money, shopping, transportation, and much more.

A to Z World Cultures spotlights 174 countries. Learn about world history, culture, food, holidays, language, and much more. This database is great for students and includes lesson plans.

A to Z Maps Online contains a wide variety of maps—cities, countries, climate, topographic, historical, and much more. It also includes Flags of the World and a GeoFindIt! Game. The maps are royalty-free and may be downloaded for use in schools or at home.

A to Z Food America features state and regional foods and recipes. It includes food trivia & quotes, food history and historical timelines, and videos of old food commercials.

Center provides expertise for starting and operating a busi-

ness: finance, management, marketing, human resources, franchising, accounting, and taxes. The database contains sample business plans, eBooks, and content from business journals.

The Farmers Market is having a Kids' Carnival on July 26th from 12 pm-2 pm. The library will have a booth set up and offer some activities.




