BELIEVE IN THE NEW LIBRARY FUNDRAISING MATCH CHALLENGE

Carthage Public Library District's Board still believes in and is committed to constructing our new onestory library building. They have been working with the architect to simplify plans in an effort to reduce costs and hope to be able to rebid

the modified project in early 2024.

A generous donor, who also believes in the library and the importance of our project to construct a new building, has created an opportunity for the community. When others make donations and pledges totaling \$100,000 by March 31, 2024, the anonymous donor will match it with an additional \$100,000. This would bring the total amount raised through our capital campaign to over \$600,000!

This is a great time of the year for charitable giving and there are many ways donors can support this matching opportunity:

- Donations in honor or memory of others are welcome gifts.
- Engraved bricks and pavers are an option.
- Tickets purchased for the Friends gift basket raffle count toward the match.
- Gift a required minimum distribution (RMD) from an IRA or other account directly to the Carthage District Library Foundation, which is a 501(c)(3) qualified charity. Consult with your financial advisor about possible tax advantages.
- Pledges count. The library now accepts pledges for monthly or quarterly donations, or for a onetime donation at a later date. For pledge forms received by March 31, the pledge amounts paid by the end of 2024 will count toward the matching challenge. Forms are available at the Library or an the Foundation's webpage.
