

Rhythm and Movement Plus Storytime

Music storytime is back! Join us on Tuesdays at 10:00 am. This active storytime is for kids ages 1-5 with a caregiver. It includes music, movement, and rhythm instruments as well as fine motor and sensory activities.



The Sept. 19 session will include a special visit by story-book character Pete the Cat.

schoolers must be accompanied by an adult).
